So far, we have collected 16 comfort quilts, and 3 sets of pillowcases. We have delivered 6 quilts to Innovative Renal Care. We still have until the November meeting to turn in quilts, so you have time. We haven't received any clothing protectors yet this year, so let me know if you need a pattern or shoe laces.

Here are some approximate dimensions for comfort quilts:

Crib 36"-45" x 45"-54" Lap 54"-60" x 68"-76" Twin 56"-64" x 84"-100" Full 70"-80" x 84"-100"

QTIP: use your birthday month as your yearly reminder.

The quilt needs to be quilted and bound. For those of you that do not quilt we have several members that have volunteered to quilt your comfort quilt. Please contact either: Suzy Morton, or Dawn Schaaf. They will let you know if they have time or if you need to move to the next person on the list. They will return the quilt to you to bind. If you would like to add your name to the list of quilters, please let Donna or Carla know.

Paperwork needs to be filled out when turning in any comfort quilt, please come and see me at the meeting if you need the paperwork. Please let me know if you need a label, backing or batting for your quilt, I can cut for you at the guild meeting.




