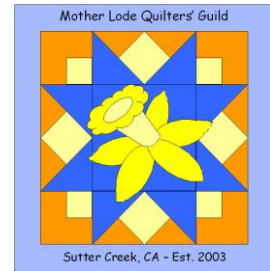

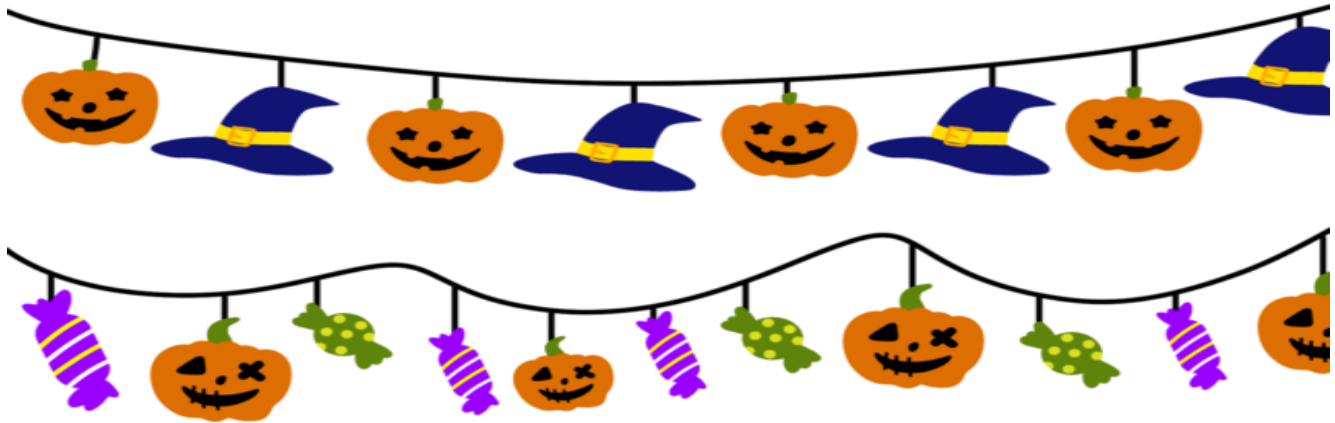

Comfort Quilts

So far, we have collected 22 comfort quilts, 7 sets of pillowcases, and 15 clothing protectors. Out of the 22 we have delivered 6 quilts to Innovative Renal Care.

We will still be collecting till the end of this month, delivering to the different agencies in November.

Here are examples of sizes for the 2024:

Here is some approximate dimension for comfort quilts:

Crib 36"-45" x 45"-54"

Lap 54"-60" x 68"-76"

Twin 56"-64" x 84"-100"

Full 70"-80" x 84"-100"

QTIP: use your birthday month as your yearly reminder.

The quilt needs to be quilted and bound. For those of you that do not quilt we have several members that have volunteered to quilt your comfort quilt. Please contact either: Suzy Morton, or Dawn Schaaf. They will let you know if they have time or if you need to move to the next person on the list. They will return the quilt to you for you to bind. If you would like to add your name to the list of quilters, please let Donna or Carla know.

Paperwork needs to be filled out when turning in any comfort quilt, please come and see me at the meeting if you need the paperwork. Please let me know if you need a label, backing or batting for your quilt, I can cut for you at the guild meeting.

Treasurer Becky Podesta

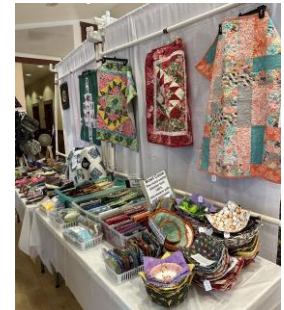

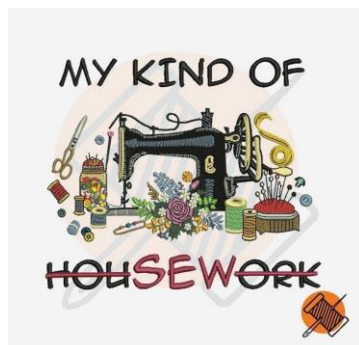

General Membership Meeting
September 23, 2024**

Officers present: President Carlene Drake, Vice President Trudy Bauman, Treasurer Becky Podesta, Secretary Misty Hall

The president called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm

Attendance reported: 30 Member's Present; 4 Guests

Meeting Minutes: Trudy approved the previous minutes, Mary Rose seconded the approval
Becky made a correction to the previous newsletter; total Opportunity ticket sales should reflect \$3270.00

Visiting Guild: Pioneer's Quilters Guild from Rocklin featuring their Bali Wedding Star

Correspondence: Marian Stroh made a \$100 donation and sent a thank you card for Rita's assistance in fixing and selling her Singer Featherweight.

Carlene shared that Pam Edwards has passed away. We will continue to collect the blocks for the quilt we were making and donate it as her husband has requested.

Country Store: We are getting through the fabric, thank you for your help. If anyone wants to volunteer to sell at the Volcano farmers market, Heather can have some boutique items ready.

Quilt Show: If you need signs, take them with you. There is a sign by Jackson Glass. We currently have 130 quilts for our show, with about 22 being displayed for sale. Prices range from \$50.00 - \$1800.00. They can pay Rebecca, take the form to her and they can pick up Sunday after the show. The Foothill Conservancy has the \$1800.00 quilt for sale to earn money for the Conservancy. Rebecca will be wearing a yellow hat and black apron to locate her for sales. Sales tax will be charged if paying via the Square, cash and checks are paid by the guild. 3% per sale and \$0.10 per transaction fee. Ladies Night Out sent pink tickets to redeem for real raffle ticket. Insurance is in, pick up keys Thursday afternoon and our vendors are filled up. Each will give a door prize, and you must be present to win. We have a food vendor at the upper building this year. Name tags will be given out on Friday.

Trudy demonstrated her binding hack today.

Comfort Quilts: Keep them coming and we need more clothing protectors

Sunshine: Will be sending a card to the Edwards family.

Opportunity Quilt: New one will be ready by February/March possibly as early as January. Tacy volunteered as our new ticket master.

Upcoming Programs: Trudy is working on 2025 programs and considering more Zoom presentations for our meetings.

Treasurer's Report: Start \$11,200.61 and ended at \$9,894.11

New Business Report: We will need a new election committee of three members. Heather, Tacy and Rebecca volunteered for the committee. We will nominate members at the October meeting, elections will happen on the same day. Installation will be the last order of business at the November meeting.

Trudy shared Le Mulet Rouge is looking for a handwork workshop for the cost of a bottle of wine. If you are interested, see Trudy and she can take you to talk to the owner.

Quilt Culture was located in Red Bluff and will possibly do a pop-up shop for us

Membership Dues: The guild took a vote to increase membership dues \$5.00 a year. This would generate approximately \$150.00 more a year. All 30 votes were “yes” for the increase.

Meeting Adjourned: 8:20 pm.
