**Treasurer Report** – Becky reported that our annual renewal is due for the storage unit and the cost has gone up considerably. The new price is \$1560.00 a year. ### Let's Get Acquainted Rhonda Simpson

Each month Rhonda is going to interview a member. This month's interviewee is Rebecca Albin.

**MLQG:** Where were you born and if out of Amador County, when did you arrive here?

**RA:** I was born in Sacramento but moved to Jackson in 1985 when I was five. I moved to Fair Oaks in 2016 and boy was that a year!! I almost died, my father and father-in-law both passed away and many close friends and my marriage took a turn towards the disastrous. It's the year that has made me the strongest. Like my mom says, "this too will pass".

**MLQG:** Certainly not a year to repeat! Working while this was happening?

**RA:** Yes, except for the hospital stay, I worked at PK Willis, where I coordinate car repossessions and before that worked in the vault at Jackson Rancheria, where I can honestly say I've touched 12.5 million dollars at one time.

**MLQG:** Car repossessions! What state has the most repossessions?

**RA:** East Coast due to the amount of parking tickets people would receive.

MLQG: Makes sense. Got kids?

**RA:** Yes, I have twin daughters, Chloe and Sydney. Both started out as junior members of this guild, but Chloe is now the youngest member, she is very creative and loves to bake and is a pastry chef. Sydney has her master's in game design and does body piercing. She is well known in the community and has recently been invited to Chicago to do specialty piercings. **RA:** No, I do not pre-wash my fabrics.




