Barn Star Sampler

January starts our Barn Star Quilt Project and here we go. I will give a demonstration at 6:15 before the meeting. Below is information if you would like to participate.

We will start this project at our January Meeting.

Demonstration will be held at 6:15 before meeting.

I will choose which blocks to work on. Each building a different technique. Techniques are described starting on Page 74. I will show her method and then instruct on other methods if I feel there is another way for easier piecing. Some months we will do more than one block.

Supplies

BARN STAR * SAMPLER

Book: Barn Star Sampler by Shelley Cavanna Each person should have a book as I will use her directions.

Fabric—See page 11 and 38 for Yardage needed This is also a good quilt to use a Fat Quarter Bundle **Tools needed are basic Quilting Tools.** Rotary Cutting tools, sewing machine, Scissors, seam ripper pins etc.

Options If the full Sampler seems a bit much you can make it smaller. See page 43 for an idea of how the quilt goes together. The blocks you make can be configured differently and you do not HAVE to make multiple blocks. You will just have a smaller project.

January Blocks: 16 and 17 Page 34 & 35. Flying Geese Technique

February Blocks: 10 & 11 Page 27 & 28 Half square triangle and square in a square. (Flying Geese, I will demo another flying geese method.)

Suzy reported that newsletter articles need to be turned in by 1/10/2024 for the January newsletter. The meeting was adjourned at 8:14pm.




