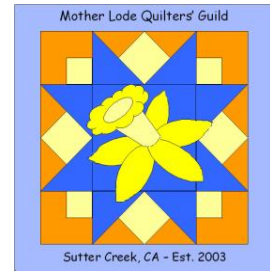

General Meeting

August 22nd, 2022

Officers present were President Trudy Baumann, Vice President Sherry Phinney, Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc and Treasurer Carlene Drake.

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm.

Membership - Members present were 25 and 6 guests.

Secretary – Terrie read the following correspondence; the guild received an invitation to visit Meissner in Sacramento for the Quilt Con display that will be visiting. There will be an evening open house on Thursday Sept. 1st from 5-7pm. The July meeting minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter. We also received bookmarks from two different guilds promoting their upcoming shows. River City Quilt Guild will have their show on September 23-25 at the Scottish Rite Center in Sacramento. The Pioneer Quilters Guild of Roseville will be November 12-13 at the Roseville Sports Center.

The July meeting notes were approved by the membership as printed in the newsletter. A motion to approve was made by Bunny Smith and seconded by Mar Douglas.

Visiting Opportunity Quilt – The Loomis Quilt and Fiber Guild brought their Quilt named Main Street Log Cabin.

President – Trudy took time to point out the involvement of members and many tasks that have been accomplished for our upcoming Quilt Show. Rita Maddock and team whose hundreds of hours have been put into designing and building a new rack system. The quilt show committee with their many hours of meeting and planning, Mary Beth Porter and her group for sewing the rack backdrop muslin pieces. This group is planning another sew day at Mary Beth's Church on Saturday 8/27. Terrie Van Scyoc for donating the muslin. Heather Beers and her work on the Country Store items and patterns. And of course, all of the other members and their contributions of quilts and items to be sold or placed in baskets. It truly takes all of us to get a show off the ground.

Treasurer – Carlene reported \$561.00 income from sales of tickets at the Amador County Fair. The checkbook had a current balance of \$9258.89

Vice President – No speaker, as all Quilt Show entry paper work was due to be turned in tonight. Ice Cream Social this month. September will be our meeting to wrap up any last-minute items before the Quilt Show, so no speaker. October will be our Quilt Show review, totals and income report. Carlene is planning a presentation on Temperature Quilts. We will also present members running for guild elections. November will be our elections and our Holiday Potluck dinner.

Library Display– Anelie collected items for the Small Quilt display for the month of September at the Amador County Library in Jackson.

Row by Row block of the month - Anelie gave a report of the Aug. 20th class she gave on paper piecing. We will not review a new row until November as there is a lot to do on the two rows due next and Quilt Show will dominate much of our time. Members work on your rows for show and tell in November at our Holiday Potluck!

Town Merchants – Ulla and Anelie reported that all but one merchant on Main Street Sutter Creek were interested in hanging a quilted item. Ulla collected them from members tonight and will distribute before the 1st of September.

Quilt Show – Anelie gave a report on the quilt show progress. She has brought signs, postcards and flyers for all members to take and disburse throughout the county. Members were encouraged to take multiple signs. Anelie collected paperwork for the Challenge Quilts. You may also email your entry paperwork to her and turn in your Challenge on Friday of the Quilt Show with regular entries. *** A Challenge form is included in this newsletter. Silent Auction entries and paperwork can be turned in any time to Terrie, or turned in on Friday of the Quilt Show. ***A Silent Auction form is included in this newsletter. Quilt Show signup sheets were out for volunteers to help work the show and set up days. Rita will need helpers to wipe down rack parts before set up and holders to be available during

set up. Set up is planned to start at 7am Friday Sept. 30th and a signup sheet was available.

We need between 20 and 30 items to have a successful Auction, and we have 10 turned in so far.
