Carlene and I both had classes on Thursday. I had a class with Sew Kind of Wonderful. They are known for their Quick Curve Ruler and patterns that use it. They have a new ruler called the Quick Straight Ruler and this was their first class teaching a new design with this ruler. Suffice it to say it is still a work in progress. Friday night was a lecture by Jennifer Sampou. She described her quilting journey beginning at C & T publishing and on to fabric and quilt designing. Her ombré fabric line is beautiful and she uses them in stunning quilts.

The outdoor quilt show was on Saturday and we arrived early to watch the quilts being hung though mostly it was to watch the firemen. Because it was early in the day, we had an opportunity to chat with some of the guilds who had quilts on display. It was interesting to see their creative ideas for challenge quilts. You may be seeing some of these ideas in a future MLQG quilt challenge.......

Friday was for shopping at the Stitchin' Post to avoid the massive crowds that turn out on Saturday. It was still very crowded! Because classes finish on Friday, the teachers' quilts are hung in the park for viewing on Saturday. It was exciting to see quilts by Tula Pink, Sarah Fielke, Sew Kind of Wonderful, Violet Craft, Jennifer Sampou and others. Sarah Fielke was the speaker on Sunday. The lecture was at the Five Pine resort and her quilts were hung through the trees. The effect was really beautiful.

We drove home Sunday morning (only 9 hours!) and back to our regular lives of housework, laundry and cooking.....sigh.

All in all, it was a great trip and we are already planning our trip to the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Sow in 2024!



Meeting came to order at 6:32pm

Visiting Opportunity Quilt - Folsom Quilters Guild brought their Tahoe quilt.

The meeting minutes from May were approved as printed in the newsletter and a motion to approve was made by Mar and seconded by Mary Beth.

Correspondence – Secretary reported none

Treasurers report – Carlene reported a balance of \$15,726.73 at the start of the month.

Trudy reported that the Farmers Market in Sutter Creek had split their venue into two locations, separating the foods from the crafts and they are both run by separate entities. This will require her to attend the event and inquire as to availability, vendors success and location attendance. The two locations are at opposite ends of town.

County Fair – Becky reported that the volunteer spaces had all been filled and fair entry tickets were handed out to volunteers. She reminded members that entry paperwork needs to be submitted to the fair by July 7th. Quilts are to be submitted Saturday July 22nd and judging will be conducted on Sunday July 23rd.

Anelie reported that the new Opportunity Quilt is finished. She explained how difficult the binding had been, but was finally done. Mar reported that there are dates planned to visit guilds with the Quilt. She will be travelling to Sacramento in July and Paradise and Lodi in August.

Our speaker for the evening was Anelie Belden performing Gadget Girl.

Anelie will be conducting a workshop to help any members finish their Row-by-Row projects. The date will be Saturday July 8th and the cost will be \$25.00. She must have 8 attendees for the class to move forward.

Heather gave a report on items still needed for the Country Store.

Becky reported discovering that our website was down as the website hosting bill had not been paid. She contacted the host and made the payment. The website was immediately active again.

Block of the Month – Going forward from our Row-by-Row project, Dawn has assembled bags of 3- 1yd cuts of coordinating fabrics for quilters to start the next project of '3 Yard Quilts'. She and Anelie shared 3 different books that Terrie will order for members. The quilts are fast and easy projects, and Dawn hopes that some will get donated back to the Guild for Community Quilts.

Newsletter articles are due to Suzy by July 10th.

Three Yard Quilt Project Dawn Schaaf – Anelie Belden
