Meeting was called to order at 6:31pm

September minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter. The motion was brought by Misty Hall and seconded by Kathy Beach.

We had a visiting Opportunity Quilt from the Concord Quilters' Guild. Their quilt was named Stars of Wonder and was the Confetti Star pattern from The Material Girlfriends.



Here's What Carlene is Working on For the Quilt Challenge

Here's a sneak peek at what I'm working on for the 2024 Quilt Show Challenge. Ouilts need to be no larger than 100 total inches around the edge. using black, white, and one color, no shades of a color, just choose one color. It can be smaller than 100 inches, but not larger due to limited display space. You might consider making a quilt that could also be entered into the Miniature Division at Amador County Fair in July. Here's the rules for entry into the fair Miniature Division - "Large scale quilts made in a miniature size consisting of traditional piecing and/or applique blocks. completed/repeated blocks are usually 3"-4" and overall quilt perimeter is no larger than 96".
