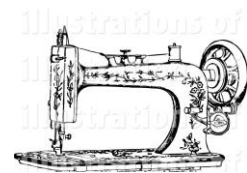

Quilt Show Information

Quilts are needed to display at our Quilt Show. Please consider entering 2 quilts, if you want to enter more great! Finish those quilts now to eliminate pre-show stress.

Volunteers are needed to work the show. Sign up clipboards will be out at the next meeting (July). Please help us on the set-up, take-down and show days.

Quilt Show Entry form will be attached to the June thru August newsletters. Start thinking about the quilts you want to enter. Entries can be turned in at any time. **The August General meeting** (8/27) will be devoted to turning in, measuring and photographing your quilt entries. That is the BIG due date!!!

Gift Basket donations for July are : 4th of JULY, Summer Camping, Picnic and Pool themes. Bring any fabrics, containers, tools, decorator items etc. that have to do with these themes. Watch for sales as you shop, re-gift new or gently used items or glean unused items as you clean out the sewing room.

REMEMBER...any donation brought to a meeting gets you an extra raffle ticket! Woohoo!

Country Store Heather urges you to continue to make items for the Country Store. Most items are quick, fun and easy to do in multiples. We have seen table runners, napkins, potholders,

Quilt 8 Challenge Our Challenge this show is based on the number **8**, as this is our 8th biennial show. Use 8 in any way that it inspires you to design your work. 8 colors, 8 blocks, 8 pointed star, the number 8, or???. Your imagination is free to create. The items must be small, 108" total circumference or less. Terrie has entry forms at the meetings if you still need one. **The Challenge is on!!!**

Silent Auction items will be needed to have an auction. Terrie has a sign-up sheet at each meeting if you know what you will be donating. We only have about 16 items so far, we need between 30 and 40. Items can be turned in to Terrie at any time. Let her know if you need paperwork.

Town Merchant Quilts – gather up a quilt or two that are a size suitable to display in a downtown Sutter Creek business. Twin size or smaller works best as most shops do not have a large display area. These quilts will be in stores from Labor Day weekend till our show to help advertise for our show. The shop owners love having a quilt on display. You will be turning in your quilt at the 8/27 meeting.

Our Guild is not large but we are always able, through the help of volunteers, to put on a great quilt show! Please help us to make this a reality once again this October 6th and 7th! Along with volunteering to take on a committee, which is fun and a great experience, all members can also help contribute to the show by doing the following;

- **Make one or two quilts to display in the show**
- **Make items to sell at the Country Store**
- **Make an item to donate to the Silent Auction**
- **Make a donation to the Gift Baskets—4th of JULY, SUMMER CAMPING, PICNIC and POOL themes for the JULY meeting.**

General Meeting

June 25, 2018

Meeting was called to order by President Anelie Belden at 6:31 pm.

Officers present were; President Anelie Belden, Vice President MaryBeth Porter, Treasurer Linda DeRosia and Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc.

June minutes were approved after a correction on the treasurer's ending balance was pointed out by Laurie Albin. It was reported as 4107.14 and should have been \$3999.79.

Membership and Guests – 33 members were present and 4 guests.

Opportunity Quilt Guest Showing– Pacific Flyway Quilters of Calusa County brought their Autumn Stars quilt that was a first-place winner at the Colusa County Fair.

President's Message - Anelie reported that it would be really easy to use the Square to process credit and debit for the show and said she was willing to loan out the 3 or 4 Squares that she has. She also asked for a volunteer to help track and record the sales of the Presale Quilt Show tickets. Dianne Krisman volunteered.

Anelie also asked members to consider possibly bidding to quilt the Opportunity Quilt when it is done.

Mystery Quilter We were given a hint in the newsletter and then asked if anyone could guess...Janice Beach guessed the identity. Barbara Haymond is our Mystery Quilter for June. And it just so happens she is here to present her story during our presentation tonight.

Secretary – The Guild was sent a thank you note from SAVOR of Amador for the donation of a quilt to their fundraiser. We received bookmarkers from the Delta Quilters Guild announcing their Quilt show 'Harvest on the Delta' August 18th and 19th in Brentwood.

Opportunity Quilt - Linda reported that construction kits are bagged and ready to hand out to volunteers. She will give a paper-piecing demo during the break if anyone needs to watch. The next workshops are scheduled on July 16th and August 20th, both Mondays. They will be held at MIY Studio in Martell from 10:00am till 4:00pm.

Trudy reported that she has two scheduled showings for the current Opportunity Quilt and needs some volunteers to take it to the meetings.

Treasurer Report – Linda reported a checkbook balance of \$4094.83.

She reported to the membership that the guild will now be responsible for collecting and paying sales tax on the Country Store and Silent Auction sales at the quilt show. We also will need to move money in the budget to fund the Opportunity Quilt construction. Somehow no money was designated to this department. Laurie Wagner motioned to apply \$450.00 to the quilt construction and Bunny Smith seconded the motion. We have tabled the discussion of exactly where it will come from. Most likely part will come out of the year end donations and part from the Speakers and Workshops department.

Vice President – Mary Beth

Quilt Show – Terrie gave a Quilt Show report and encouraged members to keep on making items for the show. The Raffle basket themes for **July** are **Summer Camping, Picnic and Pool themes**. Or bring any theme items from previous basket themes. Members are encouraged to make donations of items, fabrics, books, baskets etc.

Amador County Fair – Barb Haymond had signup sheets out for White Glove help with only a few

spots left. Juliene was also asking for volunteers to help at sign in on Saturday the 21st and hand out on Monday the 30th.

Country Store – Heather Beers reported that lots of items were turned in tonight and she also brought a pattern for a stuffed Dino. She asked the membership if anyone had a rack that could display clothing at the show. She will also contact Terrie to plan a couple of workdays to sort and price the store donations.

Publicity – Again, bookmarks were available for members to distribute.

Comfort Quilts – Dawn reported that 5 quilts were turned in and labels were done too.

Speaker –Mike Hewitt and Barbara Haymond presented an informative talk on Strokes, Stroke types, recovery and support. Mike heads up a local support group.

Break at 7:15 – 7:30

Webmaster – Rita encouraged members to go to the website and check it out as there have been some recent updates.

Newsletter – Articles for the July newsletter will be due to Suzy Morton by the 6th.

Show and Tell – Members had fun showing 4th of July and Father’s Day quilts for the month of June.

Gift Table – 5 numbers were called for gift items.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:27pm.
