We both wanted to go over the process of the steps again for all of the new members this year. As an active member you are encouraged to donate one quilt in each calendar year to MLQG so they can donate to our community.

QTIP: use your birthday month as your yearly reminder.

Here are some approximate dimension for comfort quilts:

Crib 36"-45" x 45"-54"

Lap 54"-60" x 68"-76"

Twin 56"-64" x 84"-100"

Full 70"-80" x 84"-100"

The quilt needs to be quilted and bound. If you need batting or backing material, it is available in the downstairs closet. If you need assistance either Carla or Donna can help. For those of you that do not quilt we have several members that have volunteered to quilt your comfort quilt. Please contact either: Suzy Morton, Becky Podesta, Dawn Schaaf, Linda DeRosia, or Sherry Phinney. They will let you know if they have time or if you need to move to the next person on the list. They will return the quilt to you for you to bind. If you would like to add your name to the list of quilters please let Donna or Carla know.

At the general meeting when turning in your completed quilt make sure you let Donna or Carla know you have a quilt to turn in. Paperwork needs to be filled out, and picture taken. Donna or Carla will attach the label for you.

Meeting was called to order at 6:31pm.

Members present were Past President Carla O'Dell, Vice President MaryBeth Porter, Treasurer Linda DeRosia and Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc.

President – Carla read a note from Anelie thanking the membership and their families and friends for all the help in making our Quilt Show a success. She had many compliments on the Quilts, displays and vendors. We should all be proud as a guild to put on such a great show with a small membership.

Election – Rita Maddock is heading up the election process as Anelie is absent. Rita announced the members that will be running for positions. Trudy Bauman running for President, Anelie Belden running for Vice President, Linda DeRosia running to continue as Treasurer and Terrie Van Scyoc running to continue as Secretary. Rita read the Biography of each candidate and then ballots were passed out, marked and cast.

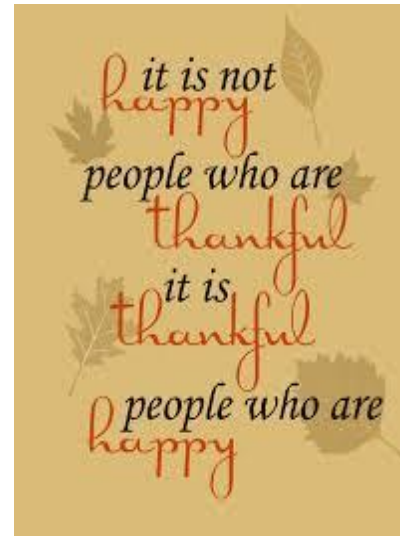
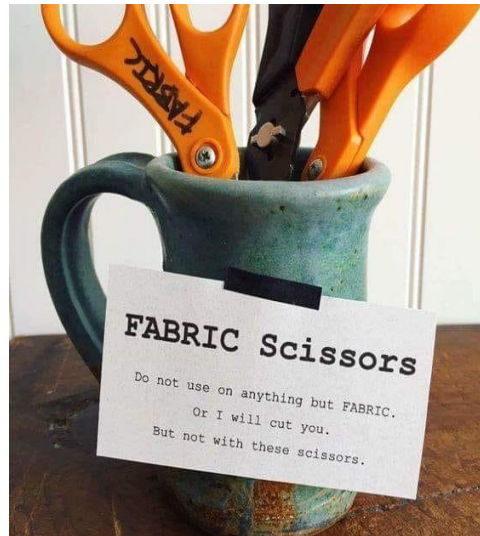
