Mother Lode Quilters' Guild General Membership meeting February 25th, 2019

Officers present – President Trudy Bauman, Vice President Anelie Belden, Treasurer Linda DeRosia and Secretary Terrie Van Scyoc.

President - Trudy Bauman called the meeting to order at 6:29pm. Trudy called upon Past President Carla O'Dell to install Anelie Belden as Vice President as she was absent at the January meeting. Membership reported 25 members and 4 guests present.

The Tokay Stitch and Quilt Guild out of Lodi brought their opportunity quilt named "Bali Jewels". Minutes from the January meeting were accepted as printed in the Newsletter.

Terrie read the mail correspondence;

Valley Quilt Guild will be having their annual Quilt Show in Yuba City on March 9^{th} and 10^{th} at the Yuba County Fairgrounds.

Carquinez Strait Stitchers will be holding their Quilt Show in Benicia on May 18th and 19th at the Historic Benicia Clock Tower.

Treasurer – Linda reported a checkbook balance of \$11,839.14 after expenses and deposits.

Vice President – Anelie asked the membership if anyone was interested in heading up a committee that would handle the fabric donated to the guild. The position would sort, measure, cut and grade the fabrics that come in before they are used in the Country Store or Basket raffle. Dawn Schaaf has volunteered to be our new.... Fabric Manager, or Fabric Floozy, or Fabric Fondler...she can pick her new title.

Opportunity Quilt – Dawn brought a section of the top to show the progress of the project. She reported that Barb Haymond has all of the appliqué pieces starched and ready to apply to the quilt. Two days have been scheduled at MIY Studio on Monday 3/4, and Monday 3/11.

Comfort Quilts – Donna and Carla reported collecting 4 clothing protectors and had picked up a load of fabric that was donated by a recent widower. The fabric is being stored at Terrie's home at this time. Donna will bring the pattern for the clothing protector to the March meeting.

Country Store – Heather has a pattern for a flat iron or curling iron carry case. She has had requests for more bowl cozies and dog leashes. Terrie will bring webbing and clips for leashes to the next meeting. Heather is looking for donations of old sewing pattern envelopes and springs out of old mattresses for some craft projects.

Publicity – Carla reported that one of our members, Ulla Van Gerrevink, was published in the Amador Ledger while teaching a knitting class at MIY Studio in Martell.


